STABLES ARE BOOKED FROM 17:00 ON THE DAY OF ARRIVAL UNTIL 16:00 ON THE DAY OF DEPARTURE A deposit of £20 per stable is required, payable by cash or card to the Stable Managers on arrival. This will be refunded on departure following inspection by the Stable Managers to ensure the stable has been left mucked out, clean, tidy, with beds banked up and in good repair.

Horses and ponies must be removed from their stables by 16:00 on the day of departure, which must be strictly adhered to. The Showing Register reserves the right to charge the daily rate for that stable and/or additional fines imposed by The Showing Register to any person failing to remove their horse/pony from any stable by the designated time.

Vacated stables must be left in the state they are found. Any stables left in an unsatisfactory condition will incur a charge. No permanent stables are available.

Stabling is available subject to capacity. Applications must be made online and fees paid in full. **The final date for application is the entries closing date**. Stables are sold on a first come, first served basis.

If stallion stables are required, please indicate in the Stallion Box section on your application.



QUALIFICATION WILL NOT GO BELOW 6TH PLACE

1. COLOURED PONY - AMATEUR OF THE YEAR QUALIFIER

Open Ridden Piebald/Skewbald, stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age except for those riding stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year . Spurs must not be worn. Ponies 153cms and under. This class may be split into Native and Non-Native at the final.

Qualifier for Equifest. The two highest exhibits not already qualified will qualify. Equifest cards must be signed in the ring.

2. COLOURED HORSE - AMATEUR OF THE YEAR QUALIFIER

Open Ridden Piebald/Skewbald, stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age except for those riding stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year. Spurs may be worn by adult riders. Animals over 153cms This class may be split into Native and Non-Native at the final.

Qualifier for Equifest. The two highest exhibits not already qualified will qualify. Equifest cards must be signed in the ring.

3. SMALL BREEDS MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND RIDDEN - AMATEUR OF THE YEAR QUALIFIER

Open to Mountain and Moorland ponies registered with their respective Pure Bred Societies of Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, Welsh A and Welsh B. Stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age, except for those riding stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year and suitably mounted. Spurs must not be worn. Qualifier for Equifest. The two highest exhibits not already qualified will qualify. Equifest cards must be signed in the ring.

4. LARGE BREEDS MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND RIDDEN - AMATEUR OF THE YEAR QUALIFIER

Open to Mountain and Moorland ponies registered with their respective Pure Bred Societies of Fells, Dales, Highlands, New Forests, Connemara, Welsh C and Welsh D. Stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age, except for those riding stallions. Spurs must not be worn.

Qualifier for Equifest. The two highest exhibits not already qualified will qualify. Equifest cards must be signed in the ring.

5. LEAD REIN MOUNTAIN AND MOOLAND RIDDEN - AMATEUR OF THE YEAR QUALIFIER

Open to Mountain and Moorland ponies registered with their Pure Bred Societies of Dartmoor, Exmoor, New Forest, Shetland, Welsh A or B. Mares or geldings 4 years old and over, not exceeding 128cms. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday but not have attained their 9th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Led by an attendant and shown in a snaffle bridle, the lead rein to be attached to the noseband only.

Qualifier for Equifest. The two highest exhibits not already qualified will qualify. Equifest cards must be signed in the ring.

6. FIRST RIDDEN MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND RIDDEN - AMATEUR OF THE YEAR QUALIFIER

Open to Mountain and Moorland ponies registered with their Pure Bred Societies of Dartmoor, Exmoor, New Forest, Shetland, Welsh A or B. Mares or geldings 4 years old and over not exceeding 128cms. Riders not to have attained their 12th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be shown in any suitable bridle.

Qualifier for Equifest. The two highest exhibits not already qualified will qualify. Equifest cards must be signed in the ring.

7. PLAITED PONY - AMATEUR OF THE YEAR QUALIFIER

Open plaited pony, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 148cms. Any suitably mounted rider. Spurs must not be worn.

Qualifier for Equifest. The two highest exhibits not already qualified will qualify. Equifest cards must be signed in the ring.

8. LEAD REIN PLAITED PONY - AMATEUR OF THE YEAR QUALIFIER

Lead Rein Pony mare or gelding not exceeding 128cms. Riders to have attained their 3rd birthday but not their 8th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be led by an attendant and shown in a snaffle bridle. Lead rein to be attached to the noseband only. Qualifier for Equifest. The two highest exhibits not already qualified will qualify. Equifest cards must be signed in the ring.

9. FIRST RIDDEN PLAITED PONY - AMATEUR OF THE YEAR QUALIFIER

First Ridden Pony, mare or gelding not exceeding 128cms. Riders not to have attained their 10^{th} birthday before 1^{st} January in the current year. To be shown in any suitable bridle. Qualifier for Equifest. The two highest exhibits not already qualified will qualify. Equifest cards must be signed in the ring.

10. HACK / RIDING HORSE RIDDEN - AMATEUR OF THE YEAR QUALIFIER

Open to Hacks and Riding Horses. mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Exceeding 148cms but Hacks not exceeding 160cms. Riders must have attained their 15th birthday by the day of the Show. Spurs may be worn by adult riders.

Qualifier for Equifest. The two highest exhibits not already qualified will qualify. Equifest cards must be signed in the ring.

11. RIDDEN COB - AMATEUR OF THE YEAR QUALIFIER

Open Ridden Cob, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Exceeding 148cms. To be shown hogged and trimmed. Riders must have attained their 15th birthday by the day of the Show. Spurs may be worn by adult riders.

Qualifier for Equifest. The two highest exhibits not already qualified will qualify. Equifest cards must be signed in the ring.

12. RIDDEN HUNTER - AMATEUR OF THE YEAR QUALIFIER

Open Ridden Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Exceeding 148cms. Riders must have attained their 15th birthday by the day of the Show. Spurs may be worn by adult riders. Qualifier for Equifest. The two highest exhibits not already qualified will qualify. Equifest cards must be signed in the ring.

ALL WEATHER ARENA 1B STARTING AT 0800

13. RIDING CLUB HORSE - AMATEUR OF THE YEAR QUALIFIER

Open Riding Club Horse, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Exceeding 148cms. Riders must have attained their 15th birthday by the day of the Show. Spurs may be worn by adult riders.

14. RIDING CLUB PONY - AMATEUR OF THE YEAR QUALIFIER

Open Riding Club Pony, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Not Exceeding 148cms. Lead reins not permitted. Spurs must not be worn.

Handlers of stallions must have obtained their 14th Birthday before the 1st January in the current year.

15. IN HAND MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND YOUNGSTOCK

Open to Registered and Unregistered M & M Ponies Yearling, 2 and 3 year olds.

Qualifier for Equifest. The two highest exhibits not already qualified will qualify. Equifest cards must be signed in the ring.

16. IN HAND MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND PONIES 4 YEARS OLD AND OVER

Open to Registered and Unregistered M & M Ponies 4 years and over.

Qualifier for Equifest. The two highest exhibits not already qualified will qualify. Equifest cards must be signed in the ring.

17. IN HAND YOUNGSTOCK EXCLUDING MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND PONIES

Any type Yearlings, 2 and 3 year olds. Registered and Unregistered – May be split Horses (Exceeding 153cms) and Ponies if entries warrant.

18. IN HAND HORSE OR PONY 4 YEARS AND OVER EXCLUDING MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND

Any type 4 years old and over Registered and Unregistered. May be split Horses (Exceeding 153cms) and Ponies if entries warrant.

19. IN HAND COLOURED YOUNGSTOCK

Horse/Pony any type Yearling, 2 and 3 year olds. Qualifier for Equifest. The two highest exhibits not already qualified will qualify. Equifest cards must be signed in the ring.

20. IN HAND COLOURED 4 YEARS OLD AND OVER

Horse/Pony any type 4 years old and over.

Qualifier for Equifest. The two highest exhibits not already qualified will qualify. Equifest cards must be signed in the ring.

21. IN HAND VETERAN 15 YEARS AND OVER

Any height, mixed age 15 years and over.

Qualifier for Equifest. The two highest exhibits not already qualified will qualify. Equifest cards must be signed in the ring.

IN HAND CHAMPIONSHIP OPEN TO FIRST AND SECOND FROM CLASSES 15 - 21

22. RIDDEN WALK AND TROT PONY

Any type Plaited or M &M. Mare or Gelding 4 years old and over not exceeding 148cms. This class is a starter class to help the confidence of novice ponies and riders. Snaffle Bridles only. Spurs must not be worn.

23. RIDDEN WALK AND TROT HORSE

Any type Plaited or M & M. Mare or Gelding 4 years and over exceeding 148cms. This class is a starter class to help the confidence of novice ponies and riders. Snaffle Bridles only. Spurs must not be worn.

24. NOVICE RIDDEN HORSE OR PONY

Mare or Gelding 4 years old and over, any type not to have won a 1st prize of £15, no galloping. Riders 18 years and over. Spurs must not be worn.

25. NOVICE RIDDEN FOR JUNIOR RIDERS 18 YEARS AND UNDER

Mare or Gelding 4 years and over, any type Riders 18 years and under on the day of the show, no galloping. Spurs must not be worn.

26. NOVICE LEAD REIN

Mare or Gelding 4 years old and over, any type not exceeding 122cms. Riders not to have attained their 9th birthday before the 1st January in the current year. To be led by an attendant and shown in a snaffle bridle, the lead rein must be attached to the noseband only.

27. NOVICE FIRST RIDDEN

Mare or Gelding 4 years old and over, any type not exceeding 128cms. Riders not to have attained their 12th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be shown in a snaffle bridle.

ALL WEATHER ARENA 2 - WORKING HUNTER RING - STARTING AT 0900

28. CLEAR ROUND WITH ASSISTANCE - 50CMS

7 Jumps no spreads – can be led. Spurs may not be worn

29. TRAINING STAKES - 50CMS

Open to horses and ponies 4 years and over any type, riders any age. 8 Jumps which will each be marked out of 10 with an overall impression mark of 20. This is a 1 phase class, conformation is not taken into consideration. Any suitable bridle. Spurs must not be worn. Riders any age, suitably mounted, riders of stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year

30. TRAINING STAKES - 60CMS

Open to horses and ponies 4 years and over any type, riders any age. 8 Jumps which will each be marked out of 10 with an overall impression mark of 20. This is a 1 phase class, conformation is not taken into consideration. Any suitable bridle. Spurs must not be worn Riders any age, suitably mounted, riders of stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year

31. TRAINING STAKES - 70CMS

Open to horses and ponies 4 years and over any type, riders any age. 8 Jumps which will each be marked out of 10 with an overall impression mark of 20. This is a 1 phase class, conformation is not taken into consideration. Any suitable bridle. Spurs must not be worn. o must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year

32. WORKING HUNTER PLAITED HORSE EXCEEDING 148CMS JUMPS MIN 70CMS – MAX 85CMS

Open to Horses 4 years and over exceeding 148cms. Riders must have attained their 15th birthday by the day of the Show. Will not be ridden by a judge. Exhibitors will give a short Show following the Jumping Phase. Maximum of 10 Jumps with a double, spreads and water tray. Any suitable bridle. Spurs may be worn by adult riders. Qualifier for Equifest. The two highest exhibits not already qualified will qualify. Equifest cards must be signed in the ring.

33. WORKING HUNTER MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND LARGE BREEDS JUMPS MAX 70CMS

Open to Ponies 4 years and over registered or unregistered Highland, Fells, Dales, New Forest, Connemara, Welsh C and D or of large breed type. Exhibitors will give a short Show following the Jumping Phase. Maximum of 10 Jumps with a double, spread but NO water tray. Any suitable bridle. Spurs must not be worn. Riders any age except for those of stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year Qualifier for Equifest. The two highest exhibits not already qualified will qualify. Equifest cards must be signed in the ring.

34. WORKING HUNTER MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND SMALL BREEDS JUMPS MAX 50CMS

Open to Ponies 4 years and over registered or unregistered. Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, Welsh A and B or of small breed type. Exhibitors will give a short Shows following the Jumping Phase. Maximum of 10 Jumps with a double but NO water tray. Any suitable bridle. Spurs must not be worn. Riders any age except for those of stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year

Qualifier for Equifest. The two highest exhibits not already qualified will qualify. Equifest cards must be signed in the ring.

35. WORKING HUNTER PLAITED PONY NOT EXCEEDING 148 CMS JUMPS MAX 50 CMS

Open to mares and geldings 4 years and over not exceeding 148cms. Exhibitors will give a short Show following the Jumping Phase. Maximum of 10 Jumps with a double, spreads but NO water tray Any suitable bridle. Spurs must not be worn. Qualifier for Equifest. The two highest exhibits not already qualified will qualify. Equifest cards must be signed in the ring.

36. STYLE AND PERFORMANCE

Open to Horses and Ponies 4 years and over. Will jump a course of 7 jumps. Not exceeding 70cms. This will be followed by a performance display of not more than 2 minutes. Any suitable bridle. Spurs may not be worn. Riders any age except for those of stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year Display to include:

Trot serpentine, 20 metre trot circle on each rein, canter on each rein, walk on a long rein across the diagonal and halt.

WORKING HUNTER PONY CHAMPIONSHIP FROM CLASSES 32-36

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Every exhibitor, competitor, owner, rider, handler, driver and/or producer (hereinafter known as "Competitor") at The Showing Show must make themselves conversant with these General Rules and Regulations, in addition to the Special Conditions applicable to the various Classes and Competitions. Competitors may only compete on the understanding that they comply with, and are bound by these Rules and Regulations and the Special Conditions relating to each Class or Competition.

CANCELLATION/CHANGES OF STABLING

There will be NO REFUNDS for stabling and no changes/transfers of any booked stables. Stable bookings must not be sub let or sold on. The booking must remain in the name of the original booking. If you have stabling queries, please contact the office at your earliest opportunity.

LIVED-IN HORSEBOXES

Bookings are subject to availability ONLY. Passes for horseboxes will be posted to competitors before the show. If you require an additional horsebox pass, please email info@theshowingregister.co.uk. Additional passes are not guaranteed and will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis dependent on availability.

CAMPING

Bookings are subject to availability ONLY. Camping will only be allowed in permitted areas of the showground as outlined by the venue and managed by the parking team. Please contact the TSR office via email info@theshowingregister.co.uk should you wish to camp onsite during the Show. Passes are not guaranteed and will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis dependent on availability. On arrival at the show, please advise the parking team that you intend to camp. Fire regulations are in place which include temporary erections of tents or living facilities in relation to distance from vehicles and surrounding area.

ON ARRIVAL AT THE SHOW

On arrival at the show, if applicable only - competitors should report to the Stable Manager's Office where their stable booking will be confirmed.

Please note that competitors with horses and/or ponies arriving at NAEC Stoneleigh Park will not be admitted between the hours of 20:00 and 06:00.

Due to FIRE REGULATIONS and the licence issued by Warwick District Council, the following will be strictly enforced:

- a. All lived-in horseboxes will be sited by Grandstand Media Ltd. personnel at the required distance and should not be moved before leaving the showground.
- b. All competitors/grooms living in horseboxes must ensure that they know the location of the nearest fire point and fire-fighting equipment.
- c. All vehicles must be equipped with a fire extinguisher.
- d. Cars which are not towing a horse trailer, caravans and motor homes are not permitted in the Horsebox Park.

LIVED-IN HORSEBOXES WITH PORTALOOS

Occupants of lived-in horseboxes with their own toilet facilities may not empty them on the showground. Anyone found to be emptying Portaloos or similar at NAEC Stoneleigh Park will be removed from site and liable to any charges imposed by the organisers. There are a number of permanent toilet blocks around the site.

PAYMENTS AND VAT

Payments for entry fees can be made online only.

VAT is applicable to stabling, vehicle parking, and bedding, and has been included in the quoted prices at 20%.

STABLE AREAS AND HORSEBOX PARK

Personal Belongings

Please note, any items left within the stabling area and horsebox park are left at the owners own risk. Grandstand Media Ltd or the Showing Register will not be held responsible for any items left unattended.

Unauthorised Use Of Stables

Any competitor or his/her representative who enters or makes use of any stable that has not been officially reserved for his/her use will be liable for the daily charge for that stable and/or additional fines imposed by The Showing Register. We reserve the right to deduct any charges from any prize money due and entries may be refused for future shows.

Smoking and Fire Risks

No smoking will be permitted in or near the stable area

No straw will be allowed on the showground, this includes straw in horseboxes and trailers

No hay may be stored under or near to any vehicle in the Horsebox Park at any time, but may be stored inside the horsebox.

Additional containers containing flammable liquids/gases are not permitted to be stored outside of lorries or caravans.

The use or possession of barbeques of any type will not be permitted at any time in the Horsebox Park or elsewhere on the showground.

IF FOUND, ANY OF THE ABOVE-MENTIONED ARTICLES WILL BE CONFISCATED AND REMOVED BY THE STABLE TEAM.

Electrical Hook-Up

Optional electrical hook-up is available to be purchased at the time of making an entry. No vehicle will be connected to the power supply that does not display a valid pass. There is no charge to park any horseboxes that are not connected to the electrical hook-up.

Motorised Vehicles

The use of electrical buggies, motorcycles, motorised scooters and other internal combustion machines is FORBIDDEN on the showground. Authorised vehicles ONLY.

Please note: Disability scooters are permitted for those who require them.

Bicycles & Scooters

The use of bicycles, scooters and similar items are not permitted in the exercise or competition areas. Bicycles and scooters ridden anywhere else on the showground are permitted but must be ridden sensibly. Failure to adhere to this may result in removal of the item by the organisers.

Dogs

All dogs must be kept on a lead at all times. No dogs are permitted in the competition and exercise areas of the showground, with the exception of assistance dogs. Please ensure you clean up after your dog. The organisers reserve the right to impose a £100 fine to anyone who is seen to not clean up after their dog.

Orders can be placed online or at the trade stand during the show.

ENTRIES

Competitors must be bona fide owners (or such persons nominated by the owner to be their authorised agent to make the entry on the owner's behalf) at the closing date of entry of the horses/ponies which they are entering.

The person who made the original entry will be considered the owner (or their authorised representative) and he/she alone will be recognised as being entitled to any prizes or prize money which may be won by the entries made by him/her. Entries must be made via the official Online Entry System at www.tsr.gsshowsystem.com and must be duly completed and authorised by the Competitor or their authorised agent.

IDENTITY DOCUMENTATION

Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all horses/ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependant on breed/type of animal. Spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.

ENTRY FEES

No entry will be accepted without the appropriate fees.

SUBSTITUTIONS

No alterations or substitutions of any entry will be allowed after the closing date of entries without permission of the Show Secretary. Entries must therefore be made in the appropriate competition(s) or class(es) for which animals are eligible.

AGE AND HEIGHT

The age and height of each horse/pony entered and any other specific particulars must be accurately stated at time of entry if required by the conditions of the competition. A false declaration or misstatement of any kind, including change of name of a horse/pony, incorrect description or false declaration of prizes won at horse shows, may at the discretion of the Organisers; disqualify a competitor from the Show and the horse/pony entered from any prize and from entering or being entered again at the Show.

In particular, a mis-statement as to the height will automatically render the animal ineligible for any judging or prizes. Competitors must be prepared to verify any statement made in a manner required by the Organisers. All entries must be made in the name of the horse/pony under which it is registered with the relevant association/society and must correspond with the name shown on the Annual or Full JMB Certificate and National Passport at all times.

DECLINING ENTRIES

The Organisers may at their absolute discretion, decline any entry, exclude or remove any person or animal from the Show or future Shows or return any entry fee without being required to assign any reason or being liable for any compensation.

FORFEITURE OF FEES AND CHARGES

Failure to exhibit any animal entered will entail forfeiture of entry fees and charges for stabling, passes and horsebox parking if appropriate. No refund will be made in any circumstances.

CANCELLATION

The organisers are entitled to cancel The Showing Register Spring Show, upon the serving of notice to the entrant of such cancellation, not less than 48 hours prior to the event; OR an event of Forces Majeure. For the purpose of this cancellation clause "Force Majeure" means an act of God including but not limited to fire, flood, earthquake, windstorm or other natural disaster, act of any sovereign including but not limited to war, invasion, act of foreign enemies, hostilities (whether war be declared or not) civil war, rebellion, revolution, insurrection, military or usurped power or confiscation, nationalisation, requisition, destruction or damage to property by or under the order of any government or public or local authority or imposition of government sanction embargo or similar action; law, judgement, order, decree, embargo, blockade, labour dispute including but not limited to strike, lockout or boycott; interruption or failure of utility service including but not limited to electric power, gas, water or telephone service; failure of the transportation of any personnel equipment, machinery supply or material required by Grandstand Group trading as The showing Register for the provision of show services breach of contract by any essential personnel; any other matter or cause beyond the control of Grandstand Group and its associated companies.

All entries shall stand for any postponed Show unless withdrawn by written notice to the Show Secretary within one week of notification or public announcement in the press of such postponement. The postponement or abandonment of the Show, either before the opening or at any time during the course of the Show, shall not give rise to any claim whatsoever against the Show or the Organisers by the competitors or others except for refund of prepaid entries in respect of classes or competitions not held. In the case of postponement a refund will only be made in respect of entries duly withdrawn. Should any competition be cancelled because of bad weather or any reason, entry fees will be refunded. It is regretted that stabling and other charges cannot be refunded.

Any competition for which there are not at least four entries under the ownership of different competitors may be cancelled. Competitors in the cancelled competition will be notified and may, at their option up to the close of entries, transfer the entries originally made to other competitions for which the animals originally entered may be eligible.

PROGRAMME AND CONDITIONS

The Organisers reserve to themselves the right to alter the timings, cancel, add to or amend any of the competitions, as necessities of the programme may require, increasing or reducing the number of Sections, and amend the Prize Money in such cases.

JUDGING

In all competitions, the Judges will select such animals in each class as they consider eligible for prizes of commendation

Further, the Judges shall have power at their discretion to withhold any prize for want of merit or any cause.

NO ADMISSION TO THE SHOW ARENA(S)

No person shall enter the Show Arena(s), which includes any space enclosed or set apart for judging or hold any communication with any Judge or examining Veterinary Surgeon without the signed permission of the Organisers or one of the Show Officials.

EXERCISE

No horse or pony will be allowed into the Competition Arenas or collecting rings for exercise at any time.

No horse or pony will be allowed into the external Exercise Areas, except at such times as are announced or posted, or as stated in the timetable.

If the exercise arena is closed, then under no circumstances is anyone on the showground permitted to use any arena for exercise. The organisers and Grandstand Group of companies will accept no liability for any accident or injury for any party failing to adhere to the rules as set out in this schedule.

The external Exercise Areas will only be open during the following times:

Monday 26th May

06:30 - 18:00

COLLECTING RING

The Stewards in charge of the Collecting Ring will have sole control of the entrance and exits to the Arena/Ring. All competitors must present their horses and ponies at the Collecting Ring prior to admission to the Arena/Ring. Class timings are subject to change, all exhibitors must make themselves aware of the running of the arena and be ready to enter as required. Horses/ponies arriving late will not be permitted to enter the Arena/Ring, this rule will be strictly enforced. Collecting rings must not be used for exercise once competition has finished each day.

DRESS

Protective headgear must be worn by anybody riding a horse/pony for any reason unless service uniform is being worn.

Correctly secured British Standard Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet current approved BSI or European Safety Standards MUST be worn by riders 18 years and under, riders competing in Mountain and Moorland classes and by riders in any jumping class. Hats maybe subject to spot checks.

Where grooms or attendants are permitted to enter the arena during preliminary or final judging they must be correctly and smartly dressed.

Body protectors are recommended whilst competing in all Working Hunter classes, including in the practice ring.

NUMBERS

Back numbers will be issued and must be worn during competitions. These will be picked up at the Show from the Secretaries

DECORATIONS

No animal may, except in Championships, be decorated with any prize rosettes until after it has been judged. Rosettes will not be duplicated if lost or mislaid except at the expense of the competitor, and should, therefore, be carefully preserved.

VETERINARY SURGEONS, DOCTORS AND FARRIER

The services of a Veterinary Surgeon, Medical Personnel and Farriers will be available on call as necessary. All costs will be the responsibility of the rider/driver/owner/handler/exhibitor/producer.

INCIVILITY

Any act of discourtesy or disobedience to any Judge, Steward or to any Show Official on the part of the competitor, groom, rider, owner, driver or agent of an animal, will, at the discretion of such Official, disqualify that animal from being judged, in which case entry fees, prizes and charges will be forfeited.

Incivility, at any stage, towards a Show Official is unacceptable and, at the complete discretion of the Show Organisers, may result in the offender being asked to leave the Show or made subject to sanctions including, but not limited to, a fine, suspension or exclusion from any part of the Show. In this connection, exhibitors and competitors are reminded of their responsibility for the actions of others.

OBJECTIONS

Any objection or protest is to be lodged by obtaining a printed Objection Form from the Show Secretary at the Show which must be completed by and signed by the Objector and delivered to the

Show Secretary accompanied by a deposit of £100.00 in cash within 30 minutes after the results have been announced in the arena, in respect of which the objection is lodged.

The organiser is unable to accept objections involving Joint Measurement Board (JMB) certificates. The objection shall be determined by the Appeals Committee who may require and receive such evidence as they think fit and in particular may require the Objector or the Competitor in respect of which such objection was lodged to make a statutory declaration upon any question of fact concerning the matter of such objection.

If the objection shall be determined against the Objector, he shall also be liable to the Show for the amount of costs and expenses occasioned by the objection and the determination thereof, unless in the opinion of the Organisers who determine the objection there existed good and reasonable grounds for the objection, when they may order to the contrary.

DISQUALIFICATION

In the event of any animal being disqualified whether as the result of any objection or otherwise, the winner of the next succeeding prize in that competition shall take the prize awarded to such disqualified animal. The result of the class will be reset as if the disqualified animal had not taken part in the competition.

RESPONSIBILITY

The organisers of The Showing Register Spring Show have no liability to the competitor for any accident, injury, damage, illness, disease or other loss occurring to the competitor's property and/or animals and shall only have liability to the competitor for personal injury or death to the extent caused by or contributed to by their negligence.

The competitor shall be responsible to the Organising Team of The Showing Register Spring Show, their principals and the Grandstand Group of companies for losses suffered by them to the extent that it arises from or is contributed to in any way by any act, neglect or omission by the competitor or by any person for whom or of any animal for which the competitor is responsible.

Competitors must have in place adequate, sufficient third-party insurance cover for the participation at The Showing Register Spring Show.

All children under the age of 14, must be accompanied by a responsible adult at all times while on the showground. Each competitor will be considered responsible in all aspects for the attendants in charge of their animals and for any other servants or agents of theirs for the consequences of any infringement by any such persons of these Rules and Regulations.

INSURANCES

All exhibitors, competitors, grooms, owners, riders, handlers, drivers and/or producers, at The Showing Register Spring Show are personally responsible for damages to any building, land, equipment or otherwise on the Showground or other areas of the NAEC or to any third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. It is a requirement that they have in force third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in or at The Showing Register Spring Show. Such insurance cover for third-party liability should be for no less than £2million.

DECISIONS

The decision of the Organisers (including their employees, representatives and show officials) the Veterinary Surgeons and any Judges upon any of the matters required by the foregoing Rules to be decided or directed by any such persons or bodies including any question of height or soundness or want of merit or exclusion from final judging or granting of any permission or otherwise shall be final and binding in all respects and no objection shall be made on account thereof nor shall any appeal lie there from on any ground whatsoever.

ORGANISERS POWERS

Subject hereinafter provided the organisers shall have power:

To interpret these Rules and Regulations and the Special Conditions applicable to the competitions and to appoint Stewards and Officials for the enforcement thereof and for the purposes of the Show generally and such persons shall have full power accordingly.

The right to make amendments to the Schedule, the General Rules and Regulations of The Showing Register Spring Show or any of the Show's classes and their associated rules as necessary at any time and use reasonable endeavours to notify such changes to each entered competitor. Any such change will be displayed in the Equestrian Office and/or Stable Manager's office at the show.

In addition to the provisions relating to Objections to determine any matter, question or difference whatever arising out of or connected with or incident to the Show or to these Rules and Regulations and the Special Conditions and the decisions of such Stewards and Officials shall be final and binding and no appeal shall lie there from, and shall also have power in case of emergency or expediency to suspend or relax any Rule or Regulation for such period and to such extent and in such manner as they think fit.

RULES

Provided always that when a competition is held under Rules, such Rules of an affiliated association or society as are appropriate to the type and class of competition shall apply, and shall have effect throughout such competition until immediately after the announcement of the results thereof

No placard or notice of any description shall be placed on any stall, vehicle or circulated in the Show without the signed permission of the Organisers.

PHOTOGRAPHY AND VIDEO CAMERAS

The use of cameras and video cameras or such other photographic or filming equipment is strictly limited to personal use and may not be used for any commercial gain.

TELEVISION/ VIDEO/ FILMING/MARKETING

It is a condition of participation at The Showing Register Spring Show that all participants agree to allow official photography and recording of themselves and their property during any part of the

show. It is a further condition of participation that all participants allow all such photographed and recorded materials to be used, at the Organiser's discretion, for broadcasting, future promotion and/or publicity in respect of The Showing Register Spring Show, its sponsors and partners.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Competitors must adhere to any Health and Safety policies issued to them from time to time by the Organisers. These will be displayed in the

Office, in necessary location on the showground and the Show Office on the showground.

HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY

The Organiser has the overall responsibility for Health and Safety. The Show is organised in accordance with Health and Safety Legislation and all who have (to any extent) control of premises or site at the show are responsible for ensuring that:

Everything reasonably practicable is done to ensure the health and safety and welfare of those attending the Show

They conduct themselves so that they do not put themselves or anyone else at risk.

Access to and egress from the site is safe.

Members of the public and competitors are equally responsible for ensuring that they do not put other persons at risk and that they co-operate with the organisers in compliance with Health and Safety legislation.

Emergencies

Emergency services must have access to all parts of the show site at all times and members of the public must not park vehicles so as to obstruct access.

First Aid points are clearly marked.

In the case of an emergency, members of the public should contact the nearest official or steward.

Horses

Horses can easily be frightened and can be dangerous. Members of the public are requested to keep clear from horse areas and to avoid behaviour that might alarm horses. Children must be supervised by parents/guardians at all times.

NOISE CURFEW

For residents living adjacent to the NAEC, the organisers in line with Warwick District Council orders are imposing a noise curfew on the showground (including the stable area and horsebox parking area) between the hours of 23:00 and 06:30 on each day. Accordingly, every competitor must use their best endeavours to ensure that noise generated in these areas is kept to an absolute minimum, so as not to cause a nuisance to neighbouring residents.

SUITABILITY OF RIDER

Equine welfare is of paramount importance and all riders must at all times be of an appropriate size and weight for the horse/pony being ridden which includes horses/ponies being warmed up and/or

exercised (anywhere at The Showing Register Spring Show to include but not limited to exercise areas Collecting Rings or vehicle parks day or night). TSR reserves the right to take further action against any exhibitor who permits any person (including an exhibitor and/or professional producer) to ride a horse or pony when the size and/or weight of the rider compromises the welfare of the horse/pony being ridden. The issue of welfare will be determined by the on-site team and will include stewards and officials having the authority to require the rider to dismount to enable a member of the onsite team to determine whether or not in the opinion of chief steward the rider is of an appropriate size and weight for the horse/pony. The decision of the chief steward shall be final.
