IMPORTANT INFORMATION

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS

Flu vaccinations are mandatory for all registered horses and ponies, and they must be in possession of a valid flu vaccination certificate. It is the owner's responsibility to ensure that the horse's vaccinations are up to date and correctly recorded on the diagrammatic vaccination record. Spot checks will be regularly carried out at shows. The horse/pony must have received the following:

AMATEUR DEFINITION

The TSR Amateur of the Year Show is for Amateur and Home-Produced competitors only. All exhibitors, horses and ponies must meet the TSR Amateur definition listed in the TSR Handbook 2025. Please make sure you have read and fully understand the eligibility to take part in classes being held at the Show.

TSR takes very seriously the spirit of these amateur/home-produced conditions any member or participant found to be contravening them may be subject to exclusion from the society and the Show with immediate effect. If you are in any doubt about your status please ask the office for guidance, the decision of The Showing Register on eligibility will be final.

SHOW ADMISSION

Admission to The Showing Register Amateur of the Year Show is free of charge. Authorised car parking will be available on site at Stoneleigh Park, attendees must have arranged this with us prior to arrival. Entrance via the Main gate, please follow signage to designated parking area.

PARKING

No vehicles, including but not limited to, caravans or mobile homes will be admitted to the showground or tents sited on the showground without a valid pass. Cars towing caravans will not be permitted to park with horseboxes.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Every exhibitor, competitor, owner, rider (hereinafter known as “Competitor”) at The Showing Register Amateur of the Year Show must make themselves conversant with these General Rules and Regulations, in addition to the Special Conditions applicable to the various Classes and Competitions. Competitors may only compete on the understanding that they comply with and are bound by these Rules and Regulations and the Special Conditions relating to each Class or Competition.

1. ONSITE STABLING

ALL STABLING IS SUBJECT TO AVAILABILITY

STABLES ARE BOOKED FROM 17:00 ON THE DAY OF ARRIVAL UNTIL 16:00 ON THE DAY OF DEPARTURE

A deposit of £20 per stable is required, payable by cash or card to the Stable Managers on arrival. This will be refunded on departure following inspection by the Stable Managers to ensure the stable has been left mucked out, clean, tidy, with beds banked up and in good repair.

Horses and ponies must be removed from their stables by 16:00 on the day of departure, which must be strictly adhered to. The Showing Register reserves the right to charge the daily rate for that stable and/or additional fines imposed by The Showing Register to any person failing to remove their horse/pony from any stable by the designated time, it further reserves the right to deduct such charge from any prize money due, and entries may be refused for future shows.

Vacated stables must be left in the state they are found. Any stables left in an unsatisfactory condition will incur a charge. No permanent stables are available.

Stabling is available subject to capacity. Applications must be made online, and fees paid in full. **The final date for application is the entries closing date.** Stables are sold on a first come, first served basis.

2.1 BEDDING

Bedding will not be provided. Bedding is available to purchase and should be purchased prior to the show with your entries. Only shavings or similar is permissible, **no straw allowed**. No hard feed will be available to purchase onsite.

2.2 CANCELLATION/CHANGES OF STABLING

There will be **NO REFUNDS** for stabling and no changes/transfers of any booked stables. Stable bookings must not be sublet or sold on. In the instance that we have a waitlist for stable and we are able to resell your stable on your behalf, we will be able to issue a refund. The booking must remain in the name of the original booking. If you have stabling queries, please contact the office at your earliest opportunity.

3. LIVED-IN HORSEBOXES

Bookings are subject to availability ONLY. Passes for horseboxes will be posted to competitors before the show. If you require an additional horsebox pass, please email info@theshowingregister.co.uk. Additional passes are not guaranteed and will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis dependent on availability.

4. LIVED-IN HORSEBOXES WITH PORTALOOS

Occupants of lived-in horseboxes with their own toilet facilities may not empty them on the showground. Anyone found to be emptying Portaloos or similar at NAEC Stoneleigh Park will be removed from site and liable to any charges imposed by the organisers. There are several permanent toilet blocks around the site.

5. ON ARRIVAL AT THE SHOW

On arrival at the show, if applicable only - competitors should report to the Stable Manager's Office where their stable booking will be confirmed.

Please note that competitors with horses and/or ponies arriving at NAEC Stoneleigh Park will not be admitted between the hours of **20:00 and 07:00**

Due to FIRE REGULATIONS and the licence issued by Warwick District Council, the following will be strictly enforced:

- a. All lived-in horseboxes will be sited by The Showing Register personnel at the required distance and should not be moved before leaving the showground.
- b. All competitors/grooms living in horseboxes must ensure that they know the location of the nearest fire point and fire-fighting equipment.
- c. All vehicles must be equipped with a fire extinguisher.
- d. Cars which are not towing a horse trailer, caravans and motor homes are not permitted in the Horsebox Park.

6. PAYMENTS AND VAT

Payments for entry fees can be made online only.

VAT is applicable to stabling, vehicle parking, and bedding, and has been included in the quoted prices at 20%.

7. STABLE AREAS AND HORSEBOX PARK

7.1 Personal Belongings

Please note, any items left within the stabling area and horsebox park are left at the owners own risk. Grandstand Media Ltd. will not be held responsible for any items left unattended.

7.2 Unauthorised use of stables

Any competitor or his/her representative who enters or makes use of any stable that has not been officially reserved for his/her use will be liable for the daily charge for that stable and/or additional fines imposed by The Showing Register. We reserve the right to deduct any charges from any prize money due, and entries may be refused for future shows.

7.3 Smoking and Fire Risks

- No smoking will be permitted in or near the stable area
- No straw will be allowed on the showground, this includes straw in horseboxes and trailers
- No hay may be stored under or near to any vehicle in the Horsebox Park at any time but may be stored inside the horsebox.
- Additional containers containing flammable liquids/gases are not permitted to be stored outside of lorries or caravans.
- The use or possession of barbeques of any type will not be permitted at any time in the Horsebox Park or elsewhere on the showground.

IF FOUND, ANY OF THE ABOVE-MENTIONED ARTICLES WILL BE CONFISCATED AND REMOVED BY THE STABLE TEAM.

7.4 Electrical Hook-Up

Optional electrical hook-up is available to be purchased at the time of making an entry. No vehicle will be connected to the power supply that does not display a valid pass. There is no charge to park any horseboxes that are not connected to the electrical hook-up.

7.5 Motorised Vehicles

The use of electrical buggies, motorcycles, motorised scooters and other internal combustion machines is **FORBIDDEN** on the showground. Authorised vehicles ONLY.

Please note: Disability scooters are permitted for those who require them.

7.6 Bicycles & Scooters

The use of bicycles, scooters and similar items are not permitted in the exercise or competition areas. Bicycles and scooters ridden anywhere else on the showground are permitted but must be ridden sensibly. Failure to adhere to this may result in removal of the item by the organisers.

7.7 Dogs

All dogs must be kept on a lead at all times. No dogs are permitted in the competition and exercise areas of the showground, with the exception of assistance dogs. Please ensure you clean up after your dog. The organisers reserve the right to impose a £100 fine to anyone who is seen to not clean up after their dog.

Orders can be placed online or at the trade stand during the show.

9. ENTRIES

Competitors must be bona fide owners (or such persons nominated by the owner to be their authorised agent to make the entry on the owner's behalf) at the closing date of entry of the horses/ponies which they are entering.

The person who made the original entry will be considered the owner (or their authorised representative) and he/she alone will be recognised as being entitled to any prizes or prize money which may be won by the entries made by him/her. Entries must be made via the official Online Entry System at <https://tsr.gsshowsystem.com/> and must be duly completed and authorised by the Competitor or their authorised agent.

10. IDENTITY DOCUMENTATION

Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all horses/ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependant on breed/type of animal. Spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.

11. ENTRY FEES

No entry will be accepted without the appropriate fees.

12. SUBSTITUTIONS

No alterations or substitutions of any entry will be allowed after the closing date of entries without permission of the Show Secretary. Entries must therefore be made in the appropriate competition(s) or class(es) for which animals are eligible.

13. DECLINING ENTRIES

The Organisers may at their absolute discretion, decline any entry, exclude or remove any person or animal from the Show or future Shows or return any entry fee without being required to assign any reason or being liable for any compensation.

14. FORFEITURE OF FEES AND CHARGES

Failure to exhibit any animal entered will entail forfeiture of entry fees and charges for stabling, passes and horsebox parking if appropriate. **No refund will be made in any circumstances.**

15. CANCELLATION

The organisers are entitled to cancel The Showing Register Amateur of the Year Show, upon the serving of notice to the entrant of such cancellation, not less than 48 hours prior to the event; OR an event of Forces Majeure. For the purpose of this cancellation clause "Force Majeure" means an act of God including but not limited to fire, flood, earthquake, windstorm or other natural disaster, act of any sovereign including but not limited to war, invasion, act of foreign enemies, hostilities (whether war be declared or not) civil war, rebellion, revolution, insurrection, military or usurped power or confiscation, nationalisation, requisition, destruction or damage to property by or under the order of any government or public or local authority or imposition of government sanction embargo or similar action; law, judgement, order, decree, embargo, blockade, labour dispute including but not limited to strike, lockout or boycott; interruption or failure of utility service including but not limited to electric power, gas, water or telephone service; failure of the transportation of any personnel equipment, machinery supply or material required by Grandstand Group trading as The Showing Register for the provision of show services breach of contract by any essential personnel; any other matter or cause beyond the control of Grandstand Group and its associated companies.

All entries shall stand for any postponed Show unless withdrawn by written notice to the Show Secretary within one week of notification or public announcement in the press of such postponement. The postponement or abandonment of the Show, either before the opening or at any time during the course of the Show, shall not give rise to any claim whatsoever against the Show or the Organisers by the competitors or others except for refund of prepaid entries in respect of classes or competitions not held. In the case of postponement, a refund will only be made in respect of entries duly withdrawn. Should any competition be cancelled because of bad weather or any reason, entry fees will be refunded. It is regretted that stabling and other charges cannot be refunded.

Any competition for which there are not at least four entries under the ownership of different competitors may be cancelled. Competitors in the cancelled competition will be notified and may, at their option up to the close of entries, transfer the entries originally made to other competitions for which the animals originally entered may be eligible.

16. PROGRAMME AND CONDITIONS

The Organisers reserve to themselves the right to alter the timings, cancel, add to or amend any of the competitions, as necessities of the programme may require, increasing or reducing the number of Sections, and amend the Prize Money in such cases.

17. JUDGING

In all competitions, the Judges will select such animals in each class as they consider eligible for prizes of commendation. Further, the Judges shall have power at their discretion to withhold any prize for want of merit or any cause.

18. NO ADMISSION TO THE SHOW ARENA(S)

No person shall enter the Show Arena(s), which includes any space enclosed or set apart for judging or hold any communication with any Judge or examining Veterinary Surgeon without the signed permission of the Organisers or one of the Show Officials.

19. EXERCISE

No horse or pony will be allowed into the Competition Arenas or collecting rings for exercise at any time.

No horse or pony will be allowed into the external Exercise Areas, except at such times as are announced or posted, or as stated in the timetable.

If the exercise arena is closed, then under no circumstances is anyone on the showground permitted to use any arena for exercise. The organisers and Grandstand Group of companies will accept no liability for any accident or injury for any party failing to adhere to the rules as set out in this schedule.

The external Exercise Areas will only be open during the following times:

Friday 28 th November	17:00 – 20:00
Saturday 29 th November	07:00– 20:00
Sunday 30 th November	07:00 – 18:00

20. COLLECTING RING

The Stewards in charge of the Collecting Ring will have sole control of the entrance and exits to the Arena/Ring. All competitors must present their horses and ponies at the Collecting Ring prior to admission to the Arena/Ring. Class timings are subject to change; all exhibitors must make themselves aware of the running of the arena and be ready to enter as required. Horses/ponies arriving late will not be permitted to enter the Arena/Ring, this rule will be strictly enforced. Collecting rings must not be used for exercise once competition has finished each day.

21. DRESS

Protective headgear must be worn by anybody riding a horse/pony for any reason unless service uniform is being worn.

Correctly secured British Standard Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet current approved BSI or European Safety Standards. **All hats must be strapped.**

Where grooms or attendants are permitted to enter the arena during preliminary or final judging they must be correctly and smartly dressed. Body protectors are recommended whilst competing in all Working Hunter, M&M Working Hunter Pony and Working Hunter Pony classes, including in the practice ring.

22. NUMBERS

Back numbers will be issued and must be worn during competitions. These will be sent out prior to the show.

23. DECORATIONS

No animal may, except in Championships, be decorated with any prize rosettes until after it has been judged. Rosettes will not be duplicated if lost or mislaid except at the expense of the competitor, and should, therefore, be carefully preserved.

24. VETERINARY SURGEONS, DOCTORS AND FARRIER

The services of a Veterinary Surgeon, Medical Personnel and Farriers will be available on call as necessary. All costs will be the responsibility of the rider/driver/owner/handler/exhibitor/producer.

25. MEDICATION CONTROL

Any animal attending The Showing Register Amateur of the Year may be subject to dope testing. The organisers reserve the right to share qualifier and HOYS entry information with the relevant showing society, and vice versa, for the purpose of HOYS matters to include, but not limited to, qualification or disciplinary.

26. INCIVILITY

- I. Any act of discourtesy or disobedience to any Judge, Steward or to any Show Official on the part of the competitor, groom, rider, owner, driver or agent of an animal, will, at the discretion of such Official, disqualify that animal from being judged, in which case entry fees, prizes and charges will be forfeited.
- II. Incivility, at any stage, towards a Show Official is unacceptable and, at the complete discretion of the Show Organisers, may result in the offender being asked to leave the Show or made subject to sanctions including, but not limited to, a fine, suspension or exclusion from any part of the Show. In this connection, exhibitors and competitors are reminded of their responsibility for the actions of others.

27. OBJECTIONS

Any objection or protest is to be lodged by obtaining a printed Objection Form from the Show Secretary at the Show which must be completed by and signed by the Objector and delivered to the Show Secretary accompanied by a deposit of **£100.00 in cash within 30 minutes** after the results have been announced in the arena, in respect of which the objection is lodged.

The organiser is unable to accept objections involving Joint Measurement Board (JMB) certificates. The objection shall be determined by the Appeals Committee who may require and receive such evidence as they think fit and in particular may require the Objector or the Competitor in respect of which such objection was lodged to make a statutory declaration upon any question of fact concerning the matter of such objection.

If the objection shall be determined against the Objector, he shall also be liable to the Show for the amount of costs and expenses occasioned by the objection and the determination thereof, unless in the opinion of the Organisers who determine the objection there existed good and reasonable grounds for the objection, when they may order to the contrary.

28. DISQUALIFICATION

In the event of any animal being disqualified whether as the result of any objection or otherwise, the winner of the next succeeding prize in that competition shall take the prize awarded to such disqualified animal. The result of the class will be reset as if the disqualified animal had not taken part in the competition.

29. RESPONSIBILITY

The organisers of The Showing Register Amateur of the Year Show have no liability to the competitor for any accident, injury, damage, illness, disease or other loss occurring to the competitor's property and/or animals and shall only have liability to the competitor for personal injury or death to the extent caused by or contributed to by their negligence.

The competitor shall be responsible to the Organising Team of The Showing Register Amateur of the Year Show, their principals and the Grandstand Group of companies for losses suffered by them to the extent that it arises from or is contributed to in any way by any act, neglect or omission by the competitor or by any person for whom or of any animal for which the competitor is responsible. Competitors must have in place adequate, sufficient third-party insurance cover for the participation at The Showing Register Amateur of the Year Show.

All children under the age of 14, must be accompanied by a responsible adult at all times while on the showground. Each competitor will be considered responsible in all aspects for the attendants in charge of their animals and for any other servants or agents of theirs for the consequences of any infringement by any such persons of these Rules and Regulations.

30. INSURANCES

All exhibitors, competitors, grooms, owners, riders, handlers, drivers and/or producers, at The Showing Register Amateur of the Year Show are personally responsible for damages to any building, land, equipment or otherwise on the Showground or other areas of the NAEC or to any third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. It is a requirement that they have in force third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in or at The Showing Register Amateur of the Year Show. Such insurance cover for third-party liability should be for no less than £2million.

31. DECISIONS

The decision of the Organisers (including their employees, representatives and show officials) the Veterinary Surgeons and any Judges upon any of the matters required by the foregoing Rules to be decided or directed by any such persons or bodies including any question of height or soundness or want of merit or exclusion from final judging or granting of any permission or otherwise shall be final and binding in all respects and no objection shall be made on account thereof nor shall any appeal lie there from on any ground whatsoever.

32. ORGANISERS POWERS

Subject hereinafter provided the organisers shall have power:

- I. To interpret these Rules and Regulations and the Special Conditions applicable to the competitions and to appoint Stewards and Officials for the enforcement thereof and for the purposes of the Show generally and such persons shall have full power accordingly.
- II. The right to make amendments to the Schedule, the General Rules and Regulations of The Showing Register or any of the Show's classes and their associated rules as necessary at any time and use reasonable endeavours to notify such changes to each entered competitor. Any such change will be displayed in the Equestrian Office and/or Stable Manager's office at the show.

- III. In addition to the provisions relating to Objections to determine any matter, question or difference whatever arising out of or connected with or incident to the Show or to these Rules and Regulations and the Special Conditions and the decisions of such Stewards and Officials shall be final and binding and no appeal shall lie there from, and shall also have power in case of emergency or expediency to suspend or relax any Rule or Regulation for such period and to such extent and in such manner as they think fit.

33. RULES

Provided always that when a competition is held under Rules, such Rules of an affiliated association or society as are appropriate to the type and class of competition shall apply and shall have effect throughout such competition until immediately after the announcement of the results thereof.

34. PLACARDS AND NOTICES

No placard or notice of any description shall be placed on any stall, vehicle or circulated in the Show without the signed permission of the Organisers.

35. PHOTOGRAPHY AND VIDEO CAMERAS

The use of cameras and video cameras or such other photographic or filming equipment is strictly limited to personal use and may not be used for any commercial gain.

36. TELEVISION/ VIDEO/ FILMING/MARKETING

It is a condition of participation at The Showing Register Amateur of the Year Show that all participants agree to allow official photography and recording of themselves and their property during any part of the show. It is a further condition of participation that all participants allow all such photographed and recorded materials to be used, at the Organiser's discretion, for broadcasting, future promotion and/or publicity in respect of The Showing Register Amateur of the year , its sponsors and partners.

37. HEALTH AND SAFETY

Competitors must adhere to any Health and Safety policies issued to them from time to time by the Organisers. These will be displayed in the Stable Manager's Office, in necessary location on the showground and the Show Office on the showground.

38. HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY

The Organiser has the overall responsibility for Health and Safety. The Show is organised in accordance with Health and Safety Legislation and all who have (to any extent) control of premises or site at the show are responsible for ensuring that:

- I) Everything reasonably practicable is done to ensure the health and safety and welfare of those attending the Show
- II) They conduct themselves so that they do not put themselves or anyone else at risk.
- III) Access to and egress from the site is safe.
- IV) Members of the public and competitors are equally responsible for ensuring that they do not put other persons at risk and that they co-operate with the organisers in compliance with Health and Safety legislation.

a. Emergencies

- I) Emergency services must have access to all parts of the show site at all times and members of the public must not park vehicles so as to obstruct access.
- II) First Aid points are clearly marked.
- III) In the case of an emergency, members of the public should contact the nearest official or steward.

b. Horses

Horses can easily be frightened and can be dangerous. Members of the public are requested to keep clear from horse areas and to avoid behaviour that might alarm horses. Children must be supervised by parents/guardians at all times.

39. NOISE CURFEW

For residents living adjacent to the NAEC, the organisers in line with Warwick District Council orders are imposing a noise curfew on the showground (including the stable area and horsebox parking area) between the hours of 23.00 and 06.30 on each day. Accordingly, every competitor must use their best endeavours to ensure that noise generated in these areas is kept to an absolute minimum, so as not to cause a nuisance to neighbouring residents.

40. SUITABILITY OF RIDER

Equine welfare is of paramount importance, and all riders must at all times be of an appropriate size and weight for the horse/pony being ridden which includes horses/ponies being warmed up and/or exercised (anywhere at The Showing Register Amateur of the Year Show to include but not limited to exercise areas Collecting Rings or vehicle parks day or night). TSR reserves the right to take further action against any exhibitor who permits any person (including an exhibitor and/or professional producer) to ride a horse or pony when the size and/or weight of the rider compromises the welfare of the horse/pony being ridden. The issue of welfare will be determined by the on-site veterinary team and will include vets, stewards and officials having the authority to require the rider to dismount to enable a member of the onsite veterinary team to determine whether or not in the opinion of chief steward the rider is of an appropriate size and weight for the horse/pony. The decision of the chief steward shall be final.

1. Equifest Large Breeds Mountain & Moorland Ridden Amateur of the Year Final

Open to Mountain and Moorland ponies registered with their respective Pure-Bred Societies of Fells, Dales, Highlands, New Forests, Connemara, Welsh C and Welsh D. Stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age except for those on stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year. Spurs must not be worn.

2. Equifest Small Breeds Mountain & Moorland Amateur of the Year Final

Open to Mountain and Moorland ponies registered with their respective Pure-Bred Societies of Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, Welsh A and Welsh B. Stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age except for those on stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year and suitably mounted. Spurs must not be worn.

3. Plaited Pony Ridden Amateur of the Year Final

Open plaited pony, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 148cms. Any suitably mounted rider. Spurs must not be worn.

4. Lead rein Mountain & Moorland Amateur of the Year Final

Open to Mountain and Moorland ponies registered with their Pure-Bred Societies of Dartmoor, Exmoor, New Forest, Shetland, Welsh A or B. Mares or geldings 4 years old and over, not exceeding 128cms. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday but not have attained their 9th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Led by an attendant and shown in a snaffle bridle, the lead rein to be attached to the noseband only.

5. C4 Events & Catering Ltd First Ridden Mountain & Moorland Amateur of the Year Final

Open to Mountain and Moorland ponies registered with their Pure-Bred Societies of Dartmoor, Exmoor, New Forest, Shetland, Welsh A or B. Mares or geldings 4 years old and over not exceeding 128cms. Riders not to have attained their 12th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be shown in any suitable bridle.

6. The Rosette Shed Lead Rein Plaited Ridden Amateur of the Year Final

Lead Rein Pony mare or gelding not exceeding 128cms. Riders to have attained their 3rd birthday but not their 9th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be led by an attendant and shown in a snaffle bridle.

Lead rein to be attached to the noseband only.

7. First Ridden Plaited Ridden Amateur of the Year Final

First Ridden Pony, mare or gelding not exceeding 128cms. Riders not to have attained their 10th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be shown in any suitable bridle.

8. Peta Roberts Coloured Pony Ridden Amateur of the Year Final

Open Ridden Piebald/Skewbald, stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age except for those on stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year. Spurs must not be worn. Ponies under 153cm. This class may be split into Native and Non-Native at the final.

9. C & M Floor & Wall Tiling LTD Coloured Horse Ridden Amateur of the Year Final

Open Ridden Piebald/Skewbald, stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age except for those on stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year. Spurs may be worn by adult riders. Animals 153cms and over. This class may be split into Native and Non-Native at the final.

10. Riding Club Pony Ridden Amateur of the Year Final

Open Riding Club Pony, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Not Exceeding 148cms. Lead reins not permitted. Spurs must not be worn.

11. The Cob Fan Cob Ridden Amateur of the Year Final

Open Ridden Cob, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Exceeding 148cms. To be shown hogged and trimmed. Riders must have attained their 15th birthday by the day of the Show. Spurs may be worn by adult riders.

12. Hack/Riding Horse Ridden Amateur of the Year Final

Open to Hacks and Riding Horses. mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Exceeding 148cms but Hacks not exceeding 160cms. Riders must have attained their 15th birthday by the day of the Show. Spurs may be worn by adult riders

13. Hunter Ridden Amateur of the Year Final

Open Ridden Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Exceeding 148cms. Riders must have attained their 15th birthday by the day of the Show. Spurs may be worn by adult riders.

14. Riding Club Horse Ridden Amateur of the Year Final

Open Riding Club Horse, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Exceeding 148cms. Riders must have attained their 15th birthday by the day of the Show. Spurs may be worn by adult riders.

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
